OBJECTIVE

The Fund aims to provide capital growth over the medium term and to offset its carbon footprint (Scope 1 and 2)¹. The FCP is exposed to the performance of listed European equities with high Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) standards and a positive financial outlook, selected on the basis of their carbon footprint and energy transition strategy. In order to achieve its objective, the Fund implements a quantitative investment strategy through the BNP Paribas Equity Europe Climate Care NTR Index, with an expected tracking error of 5% with the STOXX Europe 600 NTR index.

The carbon footprint of the portfolio is offset¹ every quarter through the purchase of verified emission reduction certificates (VERs) from the Kasigau Corridor REDD+ project in Kenya, chosen by BNP Paribas for its environmental and social impact.

LIQUID INVESTMENT STRATEGY WITH HIGH ESG STANDARDS

ESG FILTERS

The FCP provides exposure to listed European companies with high ESG standards:

- excluding the ones with significant involvement in controversial activities such as nuclear, alcohol, tobacco, gambling, coal, weapons, unconventional oil & gas or in UN Global compact violations (human rights, labour, environment and anticorruption), critical controversies concerning the environment, International Labour Organisation (ILO) conventions and the International Bill of Human Rights;
- excluding the ones with a BNP Paribas Asset Management ESG score of 9 or 10 (10 being the worst score);
- <u>selecting the ones</u> with a Moody's ESG Solutions ESG score among the top 75% in their sector or at or above 30/100.

CARBON FOOTPRINT REDUCTION

Energy transition strategy filter

Companies are also screened based on their **carbon emissions and energy transition strategy**, following a scoring method provided by Moody's ESG Solutions:

- Among the intense carbon emitters², those with the best energy transition strategy in their sector are selected;
- Overall portfolio carbon footprint reduction of at least 50% compared to the benchmark portfolio, while maximising the portfolio energy transition score.

PORTFOLIO CONSTRAINTS

The selection of companies is made to ensure a positive financial outlook, liquidity and risk reduction:

- <u>Selection of the top 67%</u> companies based on profitability, prospects and valuation criteria (return on equity, earnings, free cash flow, etc.)
- Liquidity: 10M EUR average daily volume (over 1 and 6 months)
- Risk reduction through diversification:
 - Portfolio comprised of around 100 stocks, each with a max weight of the max between 1% and the market cap weight of the company
 - Both geographical zone and sector weighting: <30% difference vs weight in the Benchmark.

Carbon offsetting

The residual carbon footprint of the index is then offset every quarter:

- The management company will assess the carbon footprint of the portfolio and determine the amount of VERs necessary for offsetting;
- VERs from the Kasigau Corridor REDD+ project will be purchased and immediately cancelled so as to materialise the offsetting and be properly recognised.

SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT: THE KASIGAU CORRIDOR REDD + PROJECT

The project became the first REDD+ project in the world to issue REDD+ carbon credits under the Verified Carbon Standard (VCS) and the Climate Community and Biodiversity Standard (CCB). The benefits of the project are:

- Protection of more than 500,000 acres of forest
- Contribution to the reduction of more than 1 million tonnes of CO2 per year (project lifespan of 30 years);
- Creation of more than 300 jobs (30% of the workforce being female);
- Development of eco-tourism, agroforestry and jobs linked to parkland conservation;
- 1/3 Income paid back to 4,500 landowners involved in the project. After project expenditures and salaries for local employees the remaining is split between Wildlife Works and local community projects, such as education scholarships and access to water initiatives.

FOCUS ON



Founded in 1997, Wildlife Works is the world's first REDD+ program development and management company, using market-based solutions to promote biodiversity conservation objectives.

The first project set up in 1998 was Rukinga, protecting wildlife in southern Kenya. It was extended in 2010 to protect 500,000 acres of the Kasigau corridor.

In 2008, in response to the evolution of the United Nations' REDD+ initiative, Wildlife Works created Wildlife Works Carbon (WWC) in order to be able to sell REDD+ carbon credits and thus support the swift expansion of the conservation model of Wildlife Works.

The Kasigau corridor REDD + project contributes to 15 out of the 17



Focus on VCS

The world's first and most widely used voluntary greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions program, which has certified more than 1500 projects, accounting for a reduction of over 200 million of CO2 emissions from the atmosphere.

Focus on CCB standard

Intended to verify the quality of GHG reduction projects with an additional aspects: social benefits.

"Social Responsible Investing. "Scope 1 concerns the direct emissions of companies (such as fuel consumption for example). Scope 2 concerns indirect emissions due to the business's activity (for example the electricity supplier's fuel consumption). Scope 3 concerns indirect emissions due to the use of products sold (such as, for example, fuel consumption by the client's electricity supplier due to use of the product). With the current status of available data, the CO2 emissions relating to Scope 3 are difficult to access and incomplete, and can only be estimated. Scope 3 will therefore not be taken into account in the context of offsetting the group's carbon footprint. "Thomson Reuters Business Classification." Companies are graded into four categories in line with their carbon level (Scope 1 + Scope 2). "Intense" emitters are those whose emissions are greater than 10MtCO2 equivalent.


