## WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

### Type

This Product is an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS). It is established as a sub-fund of BNP PARIBAS COMFORT, a FCP (fonds commun de placement- mutual investment fund), governed by the provisions of Part I of the Luxembourg Law of 17 December 2010 (the "2010 Law") relating to undertakings for collective investment as well as by Directive 2009/65.

### Term

This Product has no maturity date.

BNPP AM Luxembourg is entitled to dissolve the Product unilaterally. Dissolution may also take place in the event of a merger, total redemption of the units or when the net assets of the Product are less than the minimum regulatory amount.

### Objectives

This Product is actively managed. Such active management aims at outperforming the index MSCI AC World (EUR) NR (the "Benchmark"). Although neither the Product nor its underlying's funds intend to track it, investors should however be aware that, due to the diversified exposure obtained through the fund-of-funds approach, the Product's risk and return profile may be comparable to the risk and return profile of the Benchmark. The Product is not benchmark constrained and its performance may deviate significantly from that of the Benchmark.

The Product belongs to the category of funds-of-funds.

The Product seeks to increase the value of its assets over the medium term by investing at least 95% in capitalisation shares of open-ended investment companies, which on their turn invest in equities issued by companies applying sustainable development criteria covering social responsibility and/or environmental and/or corporate governance. The underlying companies are selected based on their Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) profile, as well as on their specific investment theme, such as the improvement of the social conditions or the environmental protection. Only companies that maintain strong environmental, social and corporate governance credentials are selected.

Incomes are systematically reinvested.

Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Luxembourg bank business days) as described in the prospectus.

### Intended retail investors

This Product is designed for investors who have neither financial expertise nor any specific knowledge to understand the Product but nevertheless may bear a total capital loss. It is suited for clients who seek growth of capital. Potential investors should have an investment horizon of at least 5 years.

## WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

### Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the Product for 5 years.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this Product compared to other Products. It shows how likely it is that the Product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this Product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. The risk category is justified by the investment mainly in stocks and shares, the value of which can fluctuate considerably. These fluctuations are often amplified in the short term.

**Be aware of currency risk. If the currency of your account is different from the currency of this Product, the payments you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.**

## WHAT HAPPENS IF BNPP AM LUXEMBOURG IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

The FCP is an undivided collection of transferable securities and / or other liquid financial assets distinct from BNPP AM Luxembourg. In the event BNPP AM Luxembourg would default, the assets of the Product/FCP, held by a depositary, would not be affected by this default.

In case of default of the depositary, the risk of financial loss of the Product/FCP is mitigated by the legal segregation of the assets of the depositary from those of the Product/FCP.

## WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

The person advising on or selling you this Product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the Product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

■ in the first year, you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the Product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

Any redemption occurring before the end of the RHP may adversely impact the performance profile of the Product. The Product has a unit redemption cap scheme that allows redemption requests to be postponed in exceptional circumstances and in accordance with the conditions set out in the Product's prospectus.
